


What are the Active Ingredients in Rhuli Gel®?

Menthol 0.3% -a local anesthetic and anti-irritant. By stimulating cold-sensitive receptors in the skin, topical menthol provides a cooling sensation regardless of the trigger, without causing a drop in temperature.

Camphor 0.3% -a well established folk remedy used topically to relieve skin pain and reduce skin itching. As a counter-irritant it may increase skin blood flow, or stimulate nerve endings thereby reducing pain and swelling.


Indications and Directions:

For minor skin irritations such as scrapes, minor burns, insect stings or bites and for minor rashes from poison ivy, poison oak or poison sumac.

- 1 Wash your hands before and after applying this topical gel.
- 2 First apply to a small affected area on the skin. If only a mild cooling sensation occurs then continue to apply to the entire affected skin area.

Poison Ivy Easy to identify as a cluster of three leaflets, it can grow on the ground, as a climbing vine or as a large bush. Found throughout North America, especially in wooded areas, open fields, on the roadside and along riverbanks. The 3 leaflets are usually green or yellow. If it is "Leaves of Three, Let Them Be". However, if you accidentally touch them or it rubs on your feet or legs, it may cause a painful, itchy, red rash. Known as a contact dermatitis, even with no known allergies, you may experience poison ivy contact dermatitis.



Insect Bites Insect bites are very common especially during the warm, humid months and in the woods, by streams or in your own backyard. Depending on the insect, bites can vary in size, redness, severity of pain and swelling. Often a puncture mark may be found in the middle of the affected area. If hives, swelling, itching occur unrelated to the site of bite, seek immediate medical attention. Symptoms of throat tightness, shortness of breath, facial swelling, wheezing, feeling dizzy, etc. especially warrants immediate medical attention.



Poison Oak Found more commonly in the western United States and British Columbia, it also has a cluster of three leaflets. Each leaflet may have roundish edges, resembling a white oak tree. As with poison ivy, if you accidentally touch them or it rubs on your feet or legs, it may cause a painful, itchy red rash, known as poison oak contact dermatitis.



Poison Sumac Found commonly in the eastern/southeastern United States, it grows as a shrub or small tree, typically in wet marshes, such as along the banks of the Mississippi River. Also it can cause a contact dermatitis, but often more severe than poison ivy or poison oak.
